## **CLASS FEES**

# CLASS OFFERINGS

# For the Beginning Player

Students new to the game should take the following classes their first year: Bridge 1, Bridge 2, and Bridge 3. They should also participate in supervised play each week.

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<u>Bridge 1 – Bidding</u>. Bidding using the modern two over one system. Each lesson includes the play of 8 hands illustrating that week's topic. Class materials: instructor handouts plus the free ACBL book *Bidding*.

- Week 1: Introduction, points, major and minor suits, no trump vs suit contracts
- Week 2: Opening a major suit
- Week 3: Opening a minor suit
- Week 4: Opening no trump and the Stayman convention
- Week 5: Opening no trump and transfers
- Week 6: Review of opening bids
- Week 7: Two over one game force
- Week 8: One no trump forcing response

#### **Opportunities for play after taking Bridge 1**

Once a class is completed, there is a 4-5 week break until the next series of classes starts. During that break, instructor-supervised play is available during the time your class normally met, as well as at other scheduled times with other instructors (see **Playing Times** handout for the current session). Supervised play is open to all players for a fee of \$5 per session.

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# <u>Bridge 2 – Competitive Bidding</u>. Communicating with partner when both teams are bidding. Each lesson includes the play of 8 hands illustrating that week's topic. Class materials: instructor handouts plus the free ACBL book *Bidding*.

- Week 1: Review of Bridge 1 concepts plus overcalls
- Week 2: Takeout double
- Week 3: Negative double
- Week 4: Review of competitive bidding
- Week 5: Defensive leads and standard carding
- Week 6: Preemptive bids
- Week 7: Strong 2-club openers and slam bidding
- Week 8: Review

## **Opportunities for play after taking Bridge 2**

Play for master points in the Newcomer games, in addition to Supervised Play.

<u>Bridge 3 – Card Play, Beginning</u>. Play of the hand and defense for beginners. Topics include: counting winners and losers, opening leads, attitude to partner, finesses, plus cue bid limit raises and reverses. Class materials: instructor handouts Prerequisites: Bridge 1 and Bridge 2

For the Intermediate Player

The following 4-level classes are available for second-year students and those who already know how to play bridge. Bridge 4A and 4B can be taken in any order. Bridge 4C gives students practice in the concepts learned in 4A and 4B. Bridge 4D is a stand-alone class that expands on the basic concepts of the 2 over 1 bidding system presented in Bridge 1 and Bridge 2.

Brush up on your skills if you haven't played in a while and/or meet new people to play with. Students taking these classes are ready to play in the Non Life Master and Open games.

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<u>Bridge 4A – Play of the Hand</u>. For those who already know the basics of playing bridge, sharpen your skills at play of the hand. Each lesson includes the play of 8 hands illustrating that week's topic. Class materials: the ACBL book *Play of the Hand*.

- Week 1: Making a plan
- Week 2: Developing Tricks Promotion and length
- Week 3: Developing Tricks The finesse
- Week 4: Eliminating Losers Ruffing and discarding
- Week 5: Watching out for entries
- Week 6: Watching out for the opponents
- Week 7: Managing the trump suit
- Week 8: Putting it all together

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<u>Bridge 4B – Defense</u>. For those who already know the basics of playing bridge, sharpen your skills in defending. Each lesson includes the play of 8 hands illustrating that week's topic. Class materials: the ACBL book *Defense*.

- Week 1: Opening leads against no trump contracts
- Week 2: Opening leads against suit contracts
- Week 3: Third-hand play
- Week 4: Second-hand play
- Week 5: Defensive signals
- Week 6: Developing defensive tricks
- Week 7: Interfering with declarer
- Week 8: Making a plan

<u>Bridge 4C – Advancing Player Workshop.</u> This course is "play" based, not lecture based. Students receive additional practice in bidding, play of the hand, and defense, before moving on to additional lecture classes.

• Weeks 1-8: Each class session presents the student with 8 selected lesson hands to bid and play. After each hand is completed, students place all cards in "dummy" position and the students and instructor analyze possible bids, as well as plans for play and defense.

<u>Bridge 4D – Introduction to "2 over 1" bidding system for experienced players.</u> The 2/1 bidding system was developed to solve several major problems in standard auctions. This class is designed for experienced bridge players who play standard and want to update their game, and also for advancing players who want to add more nuance into their auctions.

- Topic 1: The basics of two over one...when to use it, when a 2/1 bid isn't 2/1
- Topic 2: One no trump forcing (with a brief discussion of 1 NT semi-forcing)
- Topic 3: Help suit and other game invitations
- Topic 4: Dealing with interference in a 2/1 auction
- Topic 5: Invitational sequences in competitive and constructive auctions
- Topic 6: Passed hand auctions...Drury
- Topic 7: Jacoby and Texas transfers with and without slam interest
- Topic 8: Overcalls and advances how to compete effectively without getting into too much trouble.

<u>Bridge 5A – Bidding/Intermediate</u>. Sharpen your bridge playing skills while practicing your play. Each lesson includes the play of 8 hands illustrating that week's topic. Class materials: instructor handouts.

- Week 1: New minor forcing
- Week 2: 4<sup>th</sup> suit forcing
- Week 3: Cue bid limit raises
- Week 4: Help suit game tries
- Week 5: Jacoby 2NT
- Week 6: Michaels and unusual NT
- Week 7: Major transfers
- Week 8: Roman key card and Gerber

**Bridge 5B – Bidding Workshop/Intermediate 1, 2.** A play-based course, practicing the concepts learned in Bridge 5A. Sessions 1 and 2 comprise two different sets of hands to be played.

<u>Bridge 6 – Card Play, Intermediate/Advanced.</u> Intermediate topics in declarer play and defense, with 3 distinct groups of 8 topics each that rotate from session to session: Card Play 001, Card Play 002, and Card Play 003. Check Class Schedule for current rotation. Class materials: instructor handouts by permission from Eddie Kantar.

- Week 2: Establishing a long suit
- Week 3: Placing opponent's honors
- Week 4: Discarding
- Week 5: Signaling at suit contracts
- Week 6: Counting declarer's tricks
- Week 7: Deception by declarer
- Week 8: to finesse or not to finesse

#### Card Play 002

- Week 1: Opening leads vs suits
- Week 2: Leads vs no trump
- Week 3: Third hand play
- Week 4: More finessing
- Week 5: Entries
- Week 6: Strip end play
- Week 7: Loser on loser
- Week 8: Avoidance play

#### Card Play 003

- Week 1: Ducking at suit contracts
- Week 2: Handling 4<sup>th</sup> round losers
- Week 3: Simple squeezes
- Week 4: More defense vs no trump
- Week 5: The first trick
- Week 6: Common sense defense
- Week 7: No trump defense
- Week 8: Dummy recognition

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
