




John Jones

Phil Schuster Gold Life Master 1928 – 2021

Phil Schuster always had a smile on his face and a positive comment when welcoming players to his table. Jon Yinger was his partner twice a week for at least 10 years and said, "Phil was fun, smart, and an excellent bridge player. I learned a lot from him!" From their time together, there have emerged several "Schuster-isms" that have been immortalized by Jon and shared with others.

The main Schusterism involves what to lead when defending a 3NT contract when the opponents didn't try to find a Major fit. Jon explained, "Phil believed that you should lead your shortest Major in that situation assuming that, since you don't have that suit, your partner does. It works 85% of the time!"

Jon added, "Phil also taught me that if we opened but then got overcalled by 1NT, if I had a long Major but not many points, I would transfer him into that major. Again, it works most of the time."

Newbies always felt welcomed and supported at Table 11. Jon recalled, "Phil would go out of his way to encourage newer players. If they made a mistake, he would forgive it and let them correct it. He also gave them tips about the play of the hand or defense."

Jon ended by saying, "Phil always told me, 'Count, count, count.' He was a genius at counting other people's hands using the bidding, which then told him what I had. I will really miss him and our partnership when we get back to the club."


