In an extended conversation with John Crabtree, his Southern accent emerges. When asked about it, he said, "Yes, I seem to turn it off and on in different circumstances." Hailing from Knoxville, John moved to California right out of the University of Tennessee.

An electrical engineer working on router systems, John worked for a variety of companies in several locations: two years in California at North American

Aviation, five years in
Houston, 10 in Arizona, and
then back to California to
work for Hughes Aircraft
Company at its airport site.
He left engineering 30 years
ago, effectively retiring
from the profession. Since
then, he's played bridge and
worked several jobs before
fully retiring in 2009.

John got interested in bridge in the mid-1970's while working at Sperry Flight Systems in Phoenix. He explained, "I watched coworkers play bridge at lunch; then I was asked to sit in and play a hand or two." From that introduction, he was mostly self-taught but did take an eight-week course of lessons from Pat Marks. Then he started playing duplicate bridge, which he preferred, but still participated in the lunchtime social games. Today he reads ACBL's monthly Bridge Bulletin cover-to-cover to "get some new ideas."

In 1981 John returned to California, initially playing at the South Bay Bridge Club on Pacific Coast Highway. After moving to San Pedro in 1991, he became a regular at Long Beach Bridge, "It was more convenient to come to Long Beach just over the bridge." In his typical laconic style, John's advice to newer players is "Don't overbid."


Iohn recalled one of the many bridge experiences he has had. Long Beach used to post a list of masterpoints earned to date, and John was at the top of the list. Playing with a veteran player one day, he had one Ace and two Kings and raised his partner from one Heart to two. When his hand came down as dummy, his partner grumbled because they weren't in game. To stop this "feedback," John just calmly remarked, "I guess that's why I'm at the top of the list." His partner stopped complaining.

John's Tennessee family has all passed so he hasn't been back to Knoxville for 13 years. He does have two nieces, one near San Diego and another near Washington, D.C. In addition to bridge, John enjoys reading, especially books about recent history. He used to carry his book tableto-table, reading between rounds but has stopped since the pandemic. He explained, "I got my books from my local library but they totally closed for months at the beginning

Continued from Page 2 of the pandemic. I got out of the habit of reading." He also enjoys listening to NPR, which constantly plays on his car radio but added, "I'm not driving as much lately." One of his favorite programs was "All Things Considered" with its original host, Susan Stamberg. John has excellent taste, as this program was NPR's flagship news magazine, delivering in-depth reporting.

With 3,251.28 masterpoints to date, John is a Sapphire Life Master and the 12th highest in the unit. When asked if he has other bridge goals such as Diamond Life Master, he quickly commented, "No, no, no. I won't last that long."

Since the club reopened, John has been serving as a fill-in, partnering effectively with a range of players. He added, "I'm comfortable doing this because on weekends Lused to travel to Sectional Tournaments throughout the
