

## **MEET THE MASTERS**



**Sherry Troeger Ruby Life Master** 

Sherry Troeger has earned 1,679.17 masterpoints to date—becoming a Ruby Life Master in 2019.

In 1993, while she was still teaching, Sherry's husband Steve had a regular golf group so she decided to find a group activity for herself. She took different classes in

French, art, literature, and finally discovered bridge. Initially taught by Larry Slutsky, she then took "the famous George Welsh lessons." Eventually, Bob Mault became her mentor and regular partner for many years. Sherry explained, "Since I was still teaching with all the paperwork that involved, I could only play weekends and evenings as well as a lot in the summers."

Sherry was an 8th grade teacher in Whittier for 38 years. She taught theater for six years, literature and civics for most of her career, and then American and European history the last three. One of her favorite memories was being recruited to be a docent at The Huntington in San Marino, a place she took her students every year. She noted, "I attended all the classes but, in the end, my enjoyment of bridge won out." She was also honored to have her essay/application selected for a special

program sponsored by Steven Spielberg when the Holocaust Museum opened in Washington, D.C. She explained, "We were given private tours of the museum, curriculum for the students, and \$300 to spend in the gift shop for books and realia to be used in our teaching. I was so mesmerized by the museum that my tour started at 9 a.m. and didn't end until 1 a.m. when a guard gently reminded me that he had to go home." After she retired in 2004, Sherry was able to devote more time to playing bridge.

Sherry's teaching career was symbiotic with her other passions: reading and travel. A lifelong reader, she has reluctantly turned to books on tape as she adjusts to dealing with her macular degeneration. Her travel buddy is her nephew Christopher Sims. She enthusiastically noted, "Of course, I love London with its theater







Then, recalling all her trips, she nostalgically remembered studying art in Paris, visiting Rodin's house, enjoying Monet's garden of water lilies at his home, and standing where Van Gogh placed his easel when painting such classics as Wheat Field with Crows in his final years. Sherry added, "While I was standing in that field, a crow landed nearby which I thought was so symbolic."

One of her favorite trips was to Krakow, Poland. with its castle— so large it took Christopher and her three days to tour all of it. They would visit the castle each morning then enjoy Polish folkloric dancing in the afternoon followed by a Chopin concert or opera in the evening. Sherry noted, "Despite all it has endured, Poland is a great humanitarian country and has accepted over one million refugees from Ukraine. I love the soul and heart of the people of Poland." One evening they went to dinner at The Mushroom, a jazz boutique and restaurant. Christopher loves to eat and Sherry would always pay for his entrée. She said, "This restaurant was less expensive than Mexico so I told Christopher to order anything he wanted which he did!"

What does it take to be a good club director? These are the essential requirements:

- \* Knowledge and understanding of the Laws of Duplicate Bridge and ACBL regulations.
- \* Ability to work with required software and hardware.
- \* Public relations skills to balance the roles of referee, judge, teacher, psychologist and entertainment director.

#### Preparation

You can prepare for this exam by studying on your own or by enrolling in the Club Directors Course. It is an open-book, online test. You must answer at least 65 percent of the questions correctly to pass the test and become a certified ACBL Club Director.
