

Current contact data is important for a multitude reasons not only emergencies. For instance, what should we do when we find you left your cell phone at the club? We keep the ACBL membership information available for contact purposes. But this does not have a field for calling

someone in case of an emergency.

We once had index cards with member information but they are no longer available. The Board will be looking into other ways to collect this data. I suggest until then use the Work phone number in your www. ACBL.org member profile to enter a second phone we can use to contact you when necessary.

On a personal note, I thank everyone for your cards, notes, messages, and best wishes on the passing of my brother. These events are difficult for everyone. We get through them knowing we have friends that care and suuport us.

What sets POP-UPs apart? The masterpoint awards are 50% red, 50% black!


