From Linda Leventhal: My "collapse" was bidding 3NT when one opponent had a long string in one suit. They took the first seven or eight tricks. Horrible!

From Paul and Cindy Barth: We bid 3H, and they doubled. Then we raised to 4H, and they doubled again! Don't know what we were thinking. We went down of course. Doubled!

And our favorite story of a bridge "collapse": Hank and Fern were playing party bridge at home with friends. Hank. with a monster hand, bid 2C. Fern passed. Hank said nothing, lay down his cards and left the room to jump in the pool. "With his clothes on!" laughed Fern when I asked her if she minded my sharing their story. "And I never made that mistake again!"

Keep your voices low and restrict your discussions for when you are away from the tables and between rounds. Do your part to make the game fun and fair for everyone.

Kind, Necessary, Truthful?

A guiding principle for communication is often phrased as "Is it true, is it kind, is it necessary?" This reminder helps

determine if words should be spoken or not - even at the bridge table. While the exact origin is debated, with some attributing it to Socrates, Rumi, or Buddha, the core idea is to filter speech through these three "gates" or "filters" to promote mindful and constructive communication.

Players are discouraged from discussing boards during play: however, some folks cannot stop "helping." We encourage you to ask the person if they would like advice - some people do not

want constant correction while enjoying their game. Give the advice away from the field of play or better yet after the game - discussing boards or line of play during the game is prohibitied. Lastly use the "is it true, is it kind, and is it necessary" filter before dispensing that advice.




